We entered the second month of the school, Mamá Elba and the children are progressing. In addition, our multimedia volunteers have successfully started interviewing for our documentary against the Commercial Sexual Exploitation of Children.

A progress of the children

Two months have passed since Mama Elba has started. Although it is still early to have a huge impact, we are starting to see positive changes in the children. We would like to introduce the case of 5-year-old, Alicia. When Alicia first came to us, she was shy and did not speak.

After a month of the school, she became more active and is learning some words; like names of color. We believe there are two main reasons for the progress; the efforts of the teachers and her experience with playing with the other children.

Our teachers tried to communicate with her through some special toys to stimulate her senses. Although she did not respond actively for weeks, she became to know the names of the objects and has enjoyed learning the new words.

We have seen tremendous progress in her interaction with the other children. Through conversations with other students, and playing with them, she is becoming more comfortable with others and more active.

We are so happy about this progress because our mission is to improve their well-being through education. We will continue our efforts to help develop their skills!
